## 4th Sunday after Pentecost

The mustard seed becomes a great shrub that shelters birds, recalling ancient images of the tree of life. We'd expect a cedar or a sequoia, but Jesus finds the power of God better imaged in a tiny, no-account seed. It's not how we expect divine activity to look. Yet the tree of life is here, in the cross we gather around, the tree we are grafted through baptism, the true vine that nourishes us with its fruit in the cup we share. It may not seem impressive, but while nobody's looking it grows with power beyond understanding.

## First Reading: Ezekiel 17:22-24

To put this reading into context:
Tree imagery is used in a messianic prophecy to tell how the Lord will choose someone from Judah's royal family (the cedar tree) to reign over all creation. This tree will be planted on Mount Zion, the location of the holy temple.


| Before and after the reading of the Gospel, we give thanks and praise to Jesus Christ, who is revealed to us through the Gospel reading | † Gospel: Mark 4:26-34 <br> To put this gospel reading into context: <br> Jesus frequently uses parables to teach ordinary people as they are able to hear and understand. Images of sowing and growing show the vitality of God's kingdom. <br> The holy Gospel according to Mark. <br> Glory to you, O Lord. <br> ${ }^{26}$ [Jesus] said, "The kingdom of God is as if someone would scatter seed on the ground, ${ }^{27}$ and would sleep and rise night and day, and the seed would sprout and grow, they do not know how. ${ }^{28}$ The earth produces of itself, first the stalk, then the head, then the full grain in the head. ${ }^{29}$ But when the grain is ripe, at once they go in with their sickle, because the harvest has come." <br> ${ }^{30} \mathrm{He}$ also said, "With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable will we use for it? ${ }^{31} \mathrm{lt}$ is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; ${ }^{32}$ yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade." <br> ${ }^{33}$ With many such parables he spoke the word to them, as they were able to hear it; ${ }^{34}$ he did not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything in private to his disciples. <br> The gospel of the Lord. <br> Praise to you, O Christ. |
