Sky Sunday

The Season of Creation continues -- a time when the global church unites for 5 weeks of prayer and worship as we intentionally reflect on God's presence in creation and our calling to care for it. We give thanks, we pray, we lament, we hope, and we recommit ourselves to the work of caretaking and healing. This Sunday is Sky Sunday! We celebrate with the clouds, the winds, the dusk, and the dawn. We listen to the sounds of the sky proclaiming God's presence. We stand in awe before the vast reaches above us, and we thank God for the fragile stardust we call Earth.



Gospel Reading: Mark 6:45-51

To put this gospel reading into context:

Dawn is not quite day and not quite night. It is a liminal, in-between time of transition. Jesus comes to his disciples early in the morning and assures them that he is with them at all times, especially in times of transition and uncertainty.

The holy Gospel according to Mark.

Glory to you, O Lord.

⁴⁵Immediately [Jesus] made his disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, to Bethsaida, while he dismissed the crowd. ⁴⁶After saying farewell to them, he went up on the mountain to pray. ⁴⁷When evening came, the boat was out on the sea, and he was alone on the land. ⁴⁸When he saw that they were straining at the oars against an adverse wind, he came towards them early in the morning, walking on the sea. He intended to pass them by. ⁴⁹But when they saw him walking on the sea, they thought it was a ghost and cried out; ⁵⁰for they all saw him and were terrified. But immediately he spoke to them and said, "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid." ⁵¹Then he got into the boat with them and the wind ceased. And they were utterly astounded.
